The WIKIAlps project has developed a new tool that complements the WIKIAlps wiki, the **WIKIAlps database**. This new tool allows an extended search for information about projects, their outputs, stakeholders and transnational needs using a multiple filtering approach.

### FINAL CONFERENCE

The Final Conference of the WIKIAlps project took place at the premises of the European Academy of Bozen/Bolzano (EURAC) on 04 December 2014. The conference was granted the “going GreenEvent” label which certifies that it has been organised and realised according to the criteria of sustainability.



In the morning session, the project and its results were presented including the wiki, the database, the mini guides and practical recommendations.

In the afternoon, a panel discussion gave the opportunity to discuss about the project results and the future of the wiki with a representative of the Permanent Secretariat of the Alpine Convention (Marianna Elmi), the International Commission for the Protection of the Alps (Anita Konrad) and the Joint Technical Secretariat of the Alpine Space Programme (Stefania Amorosi), which are interested in

promoting the use of the wiki. The need of engaging stakeholders in contributing to the wiki was often underlined during the panel discussion. For this reason, the WIKIAlps team will further exchange ideas with interested institutions on the future development and promotion of the wiki.
